What are we doing?

From Monday 3 February for approximately three months, work will take place at Barbadoes / Warrington intersection. We will generally be working **Mondays to Fridays, 7am to 7pm**, but when required may need to work outside these hours.

Our work includes the removal of the median islands, reconstruction of kerb and channel, new footpath, stormwater, road reconstruction, ducting and light pole installation.

Traffic impacts

Lane shifts and shoulder closures will be in place.

We will need to restrict on-street parking, so will place no parking cones out before we start work. We will aim to minimise this as much as possible.

Please be on the lookout for changes in traffic management and follow the signs.

Pedestrians

Pedestrians will be detoured to the opposite side of the road at times. Please be prepared for changes to pedestrian management.

Access restrictions to your property

We may need to block vehicle access to your property for short periods from time to time. You will receive an access restriction notice in your letterbox the day before this happens to give you time to move your car. If you need access to your vehicle during that day, please move it to a nearby street before 7am. The crew on site will also door-knock affected properties before they block your access. Pedestrian access to your property will be maintained and during some periods we may maintain this with the assistance of one of our friendly staff.

We'll be using saw cutters & hydrovacs

We will be saw cutting the road or footpath at times.

We will also be using hydrovacs at times. Hydrovacs use high-pressure water and a powerful vacuum to remove soil. The soil is transferred to a debris tank to keep mess to a minimum. This is a safe, non-destructive and accurate way to remove soil or locate underground utilities, such as pipes, electrical cables and phone lines.

These are noisy works so when we need to perform these tasks, we will aim to perform them as quickly as possible. We thank you for your patience and understanding.

Changes to the intersection

The kerb will be widened in some areas and narrowed in others. We will lay pavers on the north side of the footpath of Warrington Street at Barbadoes Street intersection.

To change the intersection to traffic lights, we need to dig through the road to place ducts, backfill and lay new asphalt.
